I am writing on behalf of the Laborers International Union of North America, Local Union 270 and its members living in Santa Clara County and/or the City of San Jose ("LiUNA"), regarding the Initial Study and Mitigated Negative Declaration ("IS/MND") prepared for the Project known as AC by Marriott – West San Jose, (File No.: H17-023) for Applicant Oliver Holdings SC, LLC & Asset Gas SC, Inc., including all actions related or referring to the proposed demolition of an existing gas station and convenience store, and the construction of a seven story hotel with 168 rooms, four levels of subterranean parking, a restaurant, and associated on-site improvements at 5696 Stevens Creek Boulevard in the City of San José, Santa Clara County, California. APN: 375-12-017 ("Project").
